Even though reservations will be accepted up to August 28, 1984, it is recommended that you make your reservations immediately. We anticipate an overflow and have made arrangements for an additional motel close to the Dublin Stouffer for overflow accomodations. Needless to say, the Dublin Stouffer's will accept reservations on a "first come-first served" basis. However, you can be assured that we can accomodate all who are coming to this event. even though the Stouffer may fill up quickly. There has been a lot of excitement about this Reunion and it would be wonderful to have the biggest participation ever for this memorable event.

ACTIVITIES QUESTIONAIRE

Also enclosed with *The Strafer* is a questionaire regarding your plans for the September activities. In order for the Reunion Committee to finalize plans, we must know how many are wishing to attend the OSU-Oregon State football game so that tickets can be ordered. Ohio State football is famous for sell-out crowds, and tickets are not available at the last minute. We must know immediately on all of the activities that you wish to participate in.

You may make a donation for yourself, or in honor of a buddy you served


with, or both.

There is a B-25, licensed and flying, for sale in Oklahoma. The price: \$160,000.


