One welcome surprise was a \$50 donation to the fund by my long-time friend Mr.Robert Theis, Beverly Hills, CA. Bub was a pilot with the 38th Bomb Group in the Pacific which was well known to our group. Thank you, Bub.

I would like to tell you a little about our Jeff Blackmon, who is constructing and erecting the Memorial. Jeff is the son of an Irish stone carver and served his apprenticeship prior to enlisting in the Army Air Force on Oct. 23, 1941.

With his previous National Guard experience, he rapidly advanced to First Class Airplane Mechanic with the 309 Bomb Wing, South Carolina. After other schools and line experience as crew chief, line chief, gunner and radio operator, he was assigned to the 501st Squadron–345th Bomb Group on Nov. 11, 1942. He received additional training in Townsville, then

was off to Port Moresby, Nadzab and Biak.

On the move to the Philippines, Jeff was burned and wounded in the suicide attack on the Morrison R. Waite. After a long recuperation, he rejoined the Group in time to move to leShima. It was there that he was associated in building the Ernie Pyle Memorial.

Discharged in 1945, he chose to remain in the Active Reserve and was called to active duty in 1950 for one year. Jeff married his wife Glenna in 1946. They had 2 sons & 3 daughters, and now have 5 grandchildren.

He started a monument manufacturing plant in 1947, becoming the fourth generation of his family in the stone business. Many of you probably have already seen his work which includes historical plaques, memorials and other granite decorations. His most recognized project was erecting a bust of Orville and Wilbur Wright at Kitty Hawk. He also completed the art work at Brook Green Gardens near Georgetown, SC. His most recent project. which received a lot of press, was a large fountain (over 500 tons of granite) and waterfall for the Winston-Salem. NC Arts Council Park Plaza. He also

built War Memorials in several states, including Alaska and Puerto Rico.

You can see that our Group is indeed fortunate to have Jeff use his outstanding talents to build and erect our Memorial. It will be a Memorial of which we all can be proud, and will stand in tribute to all those who served.

B-25 Model on display

The "Red Wrath" 0024 from the 498th Squadron has been built to scale (1.05" to 1") by Del McGehe of Urbana, Illinois. He planned and constructed the model which has a wing span of 6 feet, retractable landing gear, operational flaps, cockpit to scale, and is a radio-controlled flying model.

Over 600 hours have been invested in the development. McGehe consulted with the ground and flying crews assigned to "Red Wrath" before he fashioned the parts and assembled them.

Original crew members Casselman, Judd, Lauer and Treece plan to attend the convention in Columbus. Crew members Bowen and Wardle will make an official inspection to determine their advice and instructions were faithfully followed. The model will be on display during the Reunion.


