#### Memorial Bench Fund Behind Schedule

Plans to install benches at the memorial site by late summer will not be possible unless contributions increase dramatically. # **Lifetime Memberships Now Available**

The following addition to the Constitution and By-Laws was inserted at Article IV, Section 4 by the Officers of the 345th Bombardment Reunion Association at a meeting on September 6, 1984.

There is established within the Association a class of membership to be called "Life Membership", such membership to be attained by a member paying a one-time fee of \$100.00. Each such \$100.00 is to be deposited in a separate trust fund. The annual proceeds (interest, dividends, etc.) may be used to defray current expenses of the Association.

The principal is to remain in the fund until such time as the fund is terminated by action of the Board of Directors. Upon the termination of the fund, or of the Association, the entire amount of the fund shall be donated to Purdue University in the form of a scholarship fund in the name of Major General Jarred V. Crabb, USAF (Ret).

The funds from dues and Lifetime Memberships are the only source of income to the Association, according to **Ken McClure**, Treasurer. In the past, some members have given donations, which are also tax-deductible. Membership cards have been ordered and will be mailed sometime in April to those members who have already sent in their "Lifetime Membership" dues.
