345th BG VJ-Day Publicity Needed

Bill Cavoli is spearheading a drive to publicize the 345th BG's unique mission in Japan's final surrender. All members are asked to contact their local newspaper, TV and radio stations with this story. A sample letter follows, which you are welcome to use in contacting the media:

"This letter is being sent to you on the assumption that you may be in the process of preparing a documentary, or similar coverage, marking the 40th anniversary of VJ-Day. If this is true, we believe we have some valuable historical information to offer you in your effort to make your coverage

more complete.

Just after the Japanese surrender announcement on August 15, 1945, my 345th Bomb Group - known as the "Air Apaches" - was given a rather unique honor because of our outstanding combat record in the Pacific. We were chosen to escort the Japanese aircraft carrying a delegation of 19 emissaries who, together with appropriate US representatives, were to make plans for the formal signing of the surrender on the USS Missouri. This escort mission took place on August 19, 1945, while our group was based at le Shima, a small island just west of Okinawa. You will recall that Ernie Pyle died and is buried at le

Aside from the "escort honor" given to our group, what we feel is especially unique is the fact that WE WERE THE VERY FIRST AMERICANS TO MAKE CONTACT WITH THE FORMER ENEMY UNDER OTHER-THAN-WARTIME CONDITIONS.

We believe we have significant historical information which would be elpful in making your coverage of the VJ-Day anniversary more complete, whether your coverage be in the form of a documentary or as a "story behind a story."

If you are in any way interested in the story we have to tell, please contact me at the following number: (---)

In turn, I will place you in touch with one of our members who can give you access to stories, photos, and a 10-minute silent color film "Call Word Bataan"; which covers the escort story in the air and on the ground at le Shima. The film is available in ½" VHS, ¾" and 2" tapes.

We can get you names of local members of the 345th BG who participated in this event if you care to get live interviews. Thanking you for your interest in this historial event, I remain."

What we pay for defense, with a strategy of deterrence, is the price of peace for all of us, our children, and generations to come. If our strategy is wrong and we do not spend enough, we pay in a different fashion . . . with the blood of our citizens.

We have been through this once, twice or three times, depending upon our own personal experiences. I suggest that people can and will listen to our opinions, in the light of our experiences, and we may be instrumental in aiding in preparedness again. Speak Up!

Anyone having information in this regard, please send me the names, as I would like to update my records. Hopefully, with your help, we will be able to identify ALL of these men.

Hospitality Room Chairman Melvin Best was unable to attend, but already

has procedures underway.

It was decided to distribute a survey questionaire in the October issue of *The Strafer*. Registration forms will be included in the April issue of *The Strafer*.

Shuler Gamble's Registration Committee has met with the San Antonio Convention Bureau and with La Mansion Del Norte's John Epstein, and plans and procedures are moving along ahead of schedule. Tommy Gilstrap's committee has arrangements under way for golf activities at two fine courses, and are negotiating for a B-25 fly-over or static display.

George Musket's site selection committee reported that Lackland AFB can accommodate a 100 and a 500 group and Kelley AFB has accommodations for a group of 150 and a group of 200. Present cost per person is \$9.75, not allowing for inflation at Reunion time. The 499th decided to have their banquet at the La Mansion Del Norte Hotel with Vic Tatleman in charge of that squadron's dinner and program.
