
First of all, we really missed you! You may have been out of sight, but not out of mind, no way! Second, I would like to report on some of the activities that transpired over those three days.



Flag Ceremony Opens Banquet

A beautiful "Historical Flag Ceremony" was conducted by members of the 160th Air Refuel Group Color Guard and Historical Flag Team based at Rickenbacker near Columbus. The team was led by M/Sgt. **Mike Kights**.

The ceremony consisted of seven flags, each representing an era of history of our great country. As each flag was presented and displayed, accompanied by drum beats, M/Sgt Kights narrated the historical era and the subsequent changes as the flag developed into the present form we know today.

The last flag presented was the "345th Wing Bombardment" flag. Another story on this page explains why it is a "Wing" instead of a

"Group" flag.

The ceremony closed with a "Last Mission" tape wherein the sound of a B-25 is heard starting, warming up, and proceeding to mission . . . then silence as the crew completed their last mission. This was followed by a bugle playing *Taps*, which resulted in many tears rolling down the cheeks of the audience.


345th Flag Received



As most of you know, our 345th Bomb Group never had its own flag, and the Group was deactivated after the war. Sometime during the 1950s or 1960s, though, the 345th was reactivated, this time as the 345 Bomb Wing Originally it had three squadrons: 498, 499 and 500. The Wing did have a flag that bore the Air Apache insignia our Group used. Later a 501st Squadron was reactivated. Each squadron bore the same insignia as our Bomb Group's had. The Wing's planes were all jets

Not long ago the last commander of the 345th Bomb Wing died, and shortly thereafter Ken McClure received a call from the commander's son, who thought our Group was the same as his father's Wing. His question: die we want the 345th Bomb Wing's flag and a few other artifacts. Ken was quick to say "yes".

When the flag arrived, he took it to severa flag shops, trying to get the "Wing" on the flag changed to "Group." No luck. The stitching was too intricate to change. Nevertheless the flag is now ours.



NASA Guest Speaker Captivates Diners

CW3 Thomas J. Hennen, U.S. Army, was the Terra Scout Payload Specialist aboard the Space Shuttle *Atlantis* during the STS-44 Mission November 24 - December 1, 1991.

His talk consisted on pre-flight training, experiences during the actual mission, and answers to the most asked question, "How do you manage to go to the john in space?"

The presentation included almost 300 slides. Of interest was that the 3 major oceans and 3 majordeserts have slightly different colors from space, and can be recognized simply by their colors.


